


Declaration of John Schwertz Jr.

1. My name is John Schwertz Jr. I am over the age of 18 years and I am competent to make this declaration, which is based on my personal knowledge, and my statements are true.
2. I am a resident of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, Texas. I attend Tarrant County College Northeast campus. I am in my third year of college. I may attend Tarrant County College in the Spring semester of 2010, if other college plans do not work out.
3. I support Students for Concealed Carry on Campus (SCCC), which is a national organization that advocates that licensed, law-abiding adults who carry a concealed firearm for personal protection should be allowed the right to carry their concealed firearms when on a college campus, and its purpose is to change laws and college regulations that prevent legal carry on college campuses. I want to participate in the upcoming SCCC demonstrations in November 2009 and April 2010 supporting the cause called the Empty Holster Protests.
4. I know that TCC limits demonstrations to the "Free Speech Zone." And I know that TCC has twice told students that they could not wear empty holsters anywhere on campus as part of the protests.
5. I believe that because of the College's restrictions my demonstration in the Free Speech Zone would not be effective. I want to be able to hand out flyers on the sidewalks and common areas around campus to students and faculty who are on their way to and from classes. I do not want to participate in a demonstration limited to the Free Speech Zone because it is a waste of time when hardly any people go there.
6. The College's ban on the empty holsters stops me from being able to demonstrate my message of defenselessness against crime and my opposition to the college's and the state's policy. I want to be able to demonstrate my beliefs symbolically by wearing the empty holster around campus and to classes during that week.
